Notices of Motions

Mr. Mockler gave Notice of Motion 68 that on Thursday, December 18, 1997, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Mesheau:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House a copy of the 30 page Request for Qualifications document regarding the Fredericton to Moncton Highway Project and the accompanying Criteria for Evaluation of Qualification submissions.

Mr. Mockler gave Notice of Motion 69 that on Thursday, December 18, 1997, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Sherwood:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House a copy of the 1957 page Request for Proposals (RFP) regarding the Fredericton to Moncton Highway Project and the accompanying 282 written clarifications.

Motion 46 by Mr. Volpé was, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

Mr. Sherwood gave Notice of Motion 70 that on Thursday, December 18, 1997, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Volpé:


That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House a copy of the financial feasibility study regarding the Fredericton to Moncton Highway, contracted by the Department of Finance with RBC Dominion Securities.

Mr. Speaker advised that the Standing Rules of the Legislative Assembly require two days' written notice and that Notices of Motion 68, 69, and 70, originally proposed for December 16, 1997, would be set over to December 18, 1997.

Mr. Sherwood gave Notice of Motion 71 that on Thursday, December 18, 1997, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Mockler:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documents pertaining to the recovery and disposal of New Brunswick Liquor Corporation beverage containers received by the Department of the Environment, including the times they were received and who acknowledged the receipt.

Mr. Mesheau gave Notice of Motion 72 that on Thursday, December 18, 1997, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Robichaud:



Government Motions re Business of House

Hon. Mr. Tyler announced that it was the intention of the government that following second reading the House would resume the budget debate followed by resumption of the debate on the motions for second reading of Bills 7 and 14.

Second Reading

The following Bill was read the second time and referred to the Committee of the Whole House:

Bill 17, An Act to Amend the Assessment Act.

Budget Debate

The Order of the Day for resuming the adjourned debate on the motion (Motion 21),

That this House approves in general the budgetary policy of the government, having been read,

The debate was resumed.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker called to order Mr. Mockler, the Member for Madawaska-la-Vallée, for using cutout exhibits in debate. Mr. Speaker ruled that the use of exhibits in debate was not permitted.

And Mr. Speaker having recognized another member to speak on the motion, Mr. Mockler rose on a Point of Order, requesting that Mr. Speaker state the Standing Rule or authority that was applicable to his ruling.

Mr. Speaker referred members to *Beauchesne's Parliamentary Rules and Forms 6th Edition*, citing paragraphs 501 and 502, and Standing Rule 19.

Mr. Mockler was permitted to complete his remarks.

And after some further time, Hon. Mr. Graham rose on a Point of Order regarding certain remarks made by Mr. D. Graham as being contrary to the facts.

After listening to the intervention of other honourable members on the Point of Order, Mr. Speaker ruled that it is a well established principle that statements made by members respecting themselves, particularly those within their own knowledge, have been accepted.

Subsequently, Mr. D. Graham withdrew the remarks and apologized to the House.

And after some time, Mr. MacDonald took the Chair as Deputy Speaker.

During the debate, Mr. Robichaud rose on a Point of Order, stating that Hon. Mr. Richard's remarks implied that he was not telling the truth in the House and that the remarks should be withdrawn.

Mr. Deputy Speaker ruled the Point of Order well taken and asked Hon. Mr. Richard to rephrase his remarks.

Hon. Mr. Richard subsequently withdrew the remarks and apologized to the House.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Government Motions re Business of House

Mr. Speaker, at the request of Hon. Mr. Tyler, reverted to Government Motions for the Ordering of the Business of the House.

Hon. Mr. Tyler announced that it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to be granted to her Majesty forthwith.

Committee of Supply

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. O'Donnell in the chair.

And after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair and Mr. O'Donnell, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee, proceeding in the matter under consideration, had passed the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the supply be granted to Her Majesty.

And he was directed to ask leave to sit again.

Mr. O'Donnell moved, seconded by Hon. Mr. Frenette,

THAT the House does concur with the Committee of Supply in the reports and agrees in its resolution that Supply be granted to Her Majesty.

And the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 7 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative on the following recorded division:


