Ordered referred to the Standing Committee on Private Bills.
Hon. Mr. Betts gave Notice of Motion 29 that on Wednesday, December?6, 2000, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Hon.?Mr. Lord:
THAT this House approves in general the capital budgetary policy of the government.
With leave of the House, Hon. Mr. Green moved, seconded by Hon. Mr. Sherwood:
THAT the order for third reading and passage of Bill 11, <i>An Act to Amend the All-Terrain Vehicle Act</i> , be discharged and that the Bill be referred back to the Committee of the Whole House. (Motion 30)
And the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.
Hon. Mr. Green announced that following third reading of Bills 4, 5, 6, 10, and 12, the House would proceed with second reading of Bill 13, where a number of Members had indicated their intention to

Bill 6, An Act to Amend the Business Corporations Act.

Ordered that the said Bills do pass.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 13, An Act to Amend the Education Act, a debate arose thereon.

And after some time, due to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Speaker, Mr. Ashfield, the Deputy Speaker, took the chair as Acting Speaker.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 13, be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 13, An Act to Amend the Education Act, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

Debate resumed on the amendment to Motion 1, moved by Hon. Mr. Furlong, seconded by Hon. Mr. Green, as follows:

And the debate being ended, and the question being put, the amendment was carried.

Debate resumed on Motion 1 as amended, as follows:

WHEREAS health care is of great importance to New Brunswickers;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Legislature urge the govern-ment to continue with its plans for health care renewal and sustainability as a framework within which the new regional health authorities would be expected to operate.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair.

And after some further time, Mr. Speaker interrupted proceedings and announced that the time allotted for Private Members' Motions had expired.

And then, 6 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
