Ordered that the said Bill be read a second time at the next sitting.

Mr. S. Graham gave Notice of Motion 83 that on Tuesday, May 1, 2001, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Mersereau:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documents, including but not limited to, memorandums, letters, correspondence, electronic mail, reports since May 11, 2000, relating to the site selection the River Valley Visitor Information Centre.

Mr. S. Graham gave Notice of Motion 84 that on Tuesday, May 1, 2001, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mrs. Mersereau:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House the report produced by Bill Hicks of the Heritage Branch of the Culture and Sport Secretariat regarding the potential for the former Sussex Public School.

Ms. Weir gave Notice of Motion 85 that on Tuesday, May 1, 2001, she would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. S. Graham:

That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House by the Minister of Health and Wellness

- (1) the names and remuneration of each of the senior executives and all managers of the Atlantic Health Science Corporation for each of the fiscal years 1999, 2000 and 2001;
- (2) the expenses incurred by each of the senior executives and managers of the corporation for the fiscal years 1999, 2000 and 20001 to date;
- (3) the total amount of bonuses, if any, paid to any or all senior executives and managers in the fiscal years 1999, 2000 and proposed bonuses in fiscal 2001;
- (4) the expiration date, if any, of all signed contracts and/or agreements with each senior executive and manager of the corporation;
- (5) the terms of any and all signed contracts and/or agreements with senior executives and managers including agreements for total remuneration in the event of retirement and dismissals with or without cause.
- (6) the total expenses incurred by the Chairman of the Board for the fiscal years 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2001 to date.

Hon. Mr. Green announced that following second reading and Private Members' Motions, it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Finance.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 43, *An Act to Amend the Gas Distribution Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 43, be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 43, *An Act to Amend the Gas Distribution Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

Debate resumed on the amendment to Motion 19, moved by Mr. Allaby, seconded by Mr. Richard, as follows:

AMENDMENT

THAT Motion 19 be amended by:

In the second whereas clause, strike "eliminate" and replace with "hide", and;

By amending the resolution clause by striking the words "its commitment to eliminating the tolls from" and substituting the words "hiding the tolls on".
