Mr. Allaby gave Notice of Motion 87 that on Thursday, May 23, 2002, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Richard: That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House from the Minister of Family and Community Services, the number of social workers currently on stress leave, sick leave or short or long-term disability.

Hon. Mr. P. Robichaud announced that it was the intention of the government that following second reading, the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Culture and Sport Secretariat and the Department of Training and Employment Development.
