Mr. Speaker, Mr. Premier, Ministers and Members of the Legislative Assembly:

I want to commend you for your hard work and dedication to the public business of New Brunswick during the Fourth Session of the Fifty-fourth Legislative Assembly.

After diligent consideration, you have enacted statutes which will benefit the citizens of this province, focusing particularly on securing New Brunswick's future with over 30 initiatives in public safety, finances and the economy, health care, education, families, the environment, energy, as well as New Brunswick's place within Canada.

New Brunswick's place as Canada's only officially bilingual province in Canada has been strengthened through the unanimous passage of the new Official Languages Act. This new Act builds upon our proud history, and modernizes the Act for the 21st Century,

Continuing to exercise fiscal prudence, this government tabled its third consecutive balanced budget with record investments in health care and education.

Through the passage of the Regional Health Authorities Act, An Act Respecting Nurses and Nurse Practitioners, and An Act to Amend the Registered Nursing Assistants Act, we've been able to put in place a strong foundation to renew health care in New Brunswick.

I am pleased by the work of the two new Select Committees on local governance and automobile insurance. They will continue their work by submitting their reports to the House, and government will respond to them in the up-coming session.

The business of the Fourth Session of the Fifty-fourth Legislative Assembly was very productive. With the business of this session completed, it is my privilege and responsibility to issue the command of Her Majesty that the Legislature stand prorogued.

May Divine Providence continue to guide and bless the people of New Brunswick.
