Mr. Speaker introduced Margaret Woods, Clerk Assistant of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, who is on attachment with the New Brunswick Legislature for a period of two weeks.

The following Bill was introduced and read a first time:

By Mr. S. Graham:

Bill 28, An Act to Amend the Insurance Act.

Ordered that the said Bill be read a second time at the next sitting.

Hon. Mr. P. Robichaud announced that, following the time reserved for Private Members' Motions, it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to continue consideration of the estimates for the Department of the Finance.

Debate resumed on Motion 2, moved by Mr. S. Graham, seconded by Mr. Richard, as follows:

WHEREAS an Act introducing nurse practitioners was adopted during the last session of the Legislative Assembly;

WHEREAS the University of New Brunswick only offers a part-time nurse practitioner program;

WHEREAS there is no Francophone nurse practitioner program at the Université de Moncton;

WHEREAS nurse practitioners are in very high demand across the country;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly urge the New Brunswick government to set up a dedicated fund for a nurse practitioner program at the Université de Moncton and at the University of New Brunswick.

And after some time, due to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Speaker, Mr. Bernard, the Deputy Speaker, took the chair as Acting Speaker.

And after some further time, Mr. Ashfield took the chair.

And with the unanimous consent of the House, the Member for Restigouche West was allowed to speak on Motion 2 for a further ten minutes beyond his allotted time.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair.

And after some further time, Mr. Speaker interrupted proceedings and advised that the time allotted for Private Members' Motion had expired.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Ashfield in the chair.
