WHEREAS an agreement was signed with the federal government on November 24, 2005 to transfer \$110 million over 5 years to improve the child care system in New Brunswick; and

WHEREAS more than three-quarters of mothers in New Brunswick with pre-school children work outside the home; and

WHEREAS New Brunswick parents are among the Canadians most likely to have their children in a non-parental day care situation; and

WHEREAS New Brunswick's system for licensed and regulated child care is among the worst in the country; and

WHEREAS other provinces are demanding that the federal government honour the Early Learning and Childcare agreement signed in 2005; and

WHEREAS the Early Learning and Childcare Agreement signed with the federal government last year was supported by the majority of New Brunswickers;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick call on the federal minority government to reverse their decision to unilaterally withdraw from the signed Early Learning and Childcare Agreement; and

BE IT THEREFORE FURTHER RESOLVED that all funds negotiated to improve our childcare system are transferred to New Brunswick.

WHEREAS the McKay Report tells us that too many children with learning disabilities are not receiving services; and
