Hon. Mr. Lamrock, Acting Government House Leader, announced that following second reading, it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Health.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 67, *An Act to Amend the Mining Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended and the question being put that Bill 67 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 67, *An Act to Amend the Mining Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 68, *An Act to Amend the Quarriable Substances Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended and the question being put that Bill 68 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 68, *An Act to Amend the Quarriable Substances Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 69, *An Act to Repeal the Quieting of Titles Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended and the question being put that Bill 69 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 69, *An Act to Repeal the Quieting of Titles Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. R. Boudreau in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Harrison rose on a point of order and submitted that the Minister of Health was lecturing Members of the Opposition and that it was the right of the Opposition to ask questions and to receive answers.

Hon. Mr. Lamrock spoke on the point of order.

The Chairman thanked both Members for their interventions and ruled that the point of order was not well taken.

And after some further time, Mr. Fitch rose on a point of order and submitted that it was not in order to draw the attention of the House to the absence of a Member. The Chairman ruled the point well taken.

And after some further time spent in Committee of Supply, Mr. Huntjens rose on a point of order and submitted that the Member for Rothesay had asked new questions during the estimates considered the previous sitting day and he accused the Minister of Health of lying. The Chairman requested that Mr. Huntjens withdraw the remark, which he did.

At 12.30 o'clock p.m., the Chairman left the chair to resume again at 2 o'clock p.m.

And after some time, Mr. R. Boudreau resumed the chair.

And after some further time, Mr. Kenny resumed the chair.

And after some further time spent in Committee of Supply, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair, and Mr. Kenny, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it resolved in the affirmative.

And then, 6 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
