Prayers.

Mr. Speaker rose and again requested Mr. Volpé, the Member for Madawaska-les-Lacs to withdraw the remarks in question with respect to the question of personal privilege raised by Mr. Stiles on Friday, June 29. Mr. Volpé withdrew the remarks.

Motions 50, 56, 64, 65, and 66 were, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

Mr. Volpé gave Notice of Motion 80 that on Tuesday, July 10, 2007, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. D. Graham:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documentation pertaining to the Government's proposed \$25 million budgetary decrease in administration costs for the 2007-2008 year; including a detailed breakdown of how much each department is contributing to the total reduction, as well as what programs, services or positions are being impacted by the reduction.

Hon. Mr. Jamieson, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to resume consideration of the estimates of the Department of Family and Community Services, the Advisory Council on the Status of Women, and the Department of Justice and Consumer Affairs.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Kenny in the chair.

At 12.30 o'clock p.m., the Chairman left the chair to resume again at 2 o'clock p.m.

2 o'clock p.m.

The Committee resumed with Mr. Kenny in the chair.

At 3 o'clock p.m., the Chairman declared a recess and left the chair.

3.10 o'clock p.m.

The Committee resumed with Mr. Kenny in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Kenny, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, had passed several items, and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.
