Mr. Steeves gave Notice of Motion 78 that on Thursday, June 5, 2008, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Betts:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all correspondence, communiqué, memorandums or e-mail in any format between the Government and Major Drilling Group International.

Mr. Urquhart gave Notice of Motion 79 that on Thursday, June 5, 2008, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Williams:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information, reports or studies, relied upon by the Government to determine the hazards or risks involved in uranium exploration and mining activities. Mr. Betts gave Notice of Motion 80 that on Thursday, June 5, 2008, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Steeves:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information in any format in the possession of the Government pertaining to the number of test drill holes that have been made with regards to uranium exploration, the location of each hole, and copies of all Drill Hole Reports.

Mr. C. LeBlanc gave Notice of Motion 81 that on Thursday, June 5, 2008, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Carr:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information, in any format, in the possession of the Government related to any trips by the Department of Health and other Departments to Australia or England in 2007 including the names of all the people that attended, the meeting itineraries, the names of the persons meetings were held with, all expense reports and a full itinerary including any additional stops and reports made concerning the trip and the information gathered.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Education until 6 o'clock p.m.; following which, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole House to consider Bill 43; thence, the House would proceed to second reading of Bills 56, 57, 59 and 66; and thence, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to resume consideration of the estimates of the Department of Education.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Fraser, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, and asked leave to sit again. Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole with Mr. Fraser in the chair.
