Prayers.

Mr. Betts, Member for Moncton Crescent, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Moncton and surrounding areas urging the government to make changes to legislation in order to protect water, health, and property rights and supporting a moratorium on the exploration of uranium in New Brunswick. (Petition 30)

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Hon. Mr. Doucet laid upon the table of the House documents entitled: *Common Vision - Common Future, Be sustainable. Be economically viable. A Fisheries Renewal Framework for New Brunswick* and *Common Vision - Common Future, Be sustainable. Be economically viable. Fisheries Renewal Framework 2008-2009 Action Plan*.

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During Statements by Ministers, Mr. Carr rose on a point of order and submitted that the Premier's statement had not been brief and offered arguments beyond the fair bounds of explanation in contravention of Standing Rule 40(1). The Honourable the Premier withdrew the offending remarks.

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The following Bills were introduced and read a first time:

Bill 80, *Nursing Homes Pension Plans Act*.

By Hon. Mr. Ouellette,

Bill 81, *An Act to Amend the Natural Products Act*.

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With leave of the House, Hon. Mr. Murphy moved the following resolution, seconded by the Honourable the Premier: (Motion 85)

WHEREAS pursuant to Standing Rule 39, the Minister of Health intends to file with the Clerk of the House a paper on the Health Care Directives; and

WHEREAS it is the intention of government that the said paper be considered by the Standing Committee on Law Amendments;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT upon being filed, the said paper on the Health Care Directives be deemed to have been referred to the Standing Committee on Law Amendments for review.

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And the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.

With leave of the House, Hon. Mr. Murphy moved the following resolution, seconded by the Honourable the Premier: (Motion 86)  
WHEREAS pursuant to Standing Rule 39, the Minister of Health intends to file with the Clerk of the House a paper on Personal Health Information Access and Privacy legislation; and  
WHEREAS it is the intention of government that the said paper be considered by the Standing Committee on Law Amendments;  
THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT upon being filed, the said paper on Personal Health Information Access and Privacy legislation be deemed to have been referred to the Standing Committee on Law Amendments for review.

And the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of the government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Provincial Capital Commission, New Brunswick Advisory Council on Youth, Secretariat for Community Non-Profit Organizations, Legislative Assembly and Department of Public Safety; following which, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider Bills 43, 61, 62, 75 and 77.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

And after some further time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Fraser, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, had passed several items and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.
