Prayers.

Motions 45, 55, 58, 65, 68, 70 and 74 were, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of the government that the House proceed with third reading; following which, the House would consider Motion 89; thence, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider Bills 66, 78, 57, 77, 59, 61, 62, 80, 69, 56, 63, 74, 81, 75, and 72.

It was agreed by unanimous consent that any time remaining in the two hours allocated for the consideration of Motion 89 be added to the time allocated for consideration of Bills pursuant to said motion.

The following Bills were read a third time:

Bill 43, An Act to Amend the Fish and Wildlife Act.

Bill 70, Cross-Border Policing Act.

Bill 71, An Act to Amend the Police Act.

Ordered that the said Bills do pass.

Pursuant to Notice of Motion 89, Mr. MacIntyre moved, seconded by Mr. Brewer:

THAT, notwithstanding the Standing Rules of the Assembly, following the adoption of this motion, there shall be 16 remaining hours for the proceedings at all stages of the passing of Bills 43, 56, 57, 59, 61, 62, 63, 66, 69, 70, 71, 72, 74, 75, 77, 78, 80, 81 and 82 which shall include the time spent considering said Bills from June 11, 2008 and onward, and at the expiration of the said 16 hours, unless sooner concluded, the Speaker, or the Chair of the Committee of the Whole House, shall interrupt the proceedings and put every question necessary to dispose of the order for second reading of the said Bills; the order for consideration of the said Bills in the Committee of the Whole House and report of the Bills to the House; and the order for third reading of the said Bills; and where necessary, the said Bills shall be allowed to receive more than one reading or advance more than one stage in one day.

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And the question being put, a debate ensued.

And after some time, Hon. Mr. Albert welcomed to the House a delegation from Cameroun: Mr. Ngathé Kom, Director of Vocational Training and Guidance; Emmanuel Mboudje, department head, training in industrial and agricultural trades; and Olivier Nzepa, consultant with ANAIS.

Debate resumed.

And the debate being ended and the question being put, Motion 89 was carried.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole with Mr. Kenny in the chair.

At 6 o'clock, the Chairman left the chair to resume again at 7 o'clock p.m.

And after some further time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair and Mr. Kenny, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported:

- Bill 61, Statute Law Amendment Act 2008.
- Bill 62, An Act to Amend the Judicature Act.

Bill 78, Loan Act 2008.

And that the Committee had directed that he report the following Bills as amended:

- Bill 66, Gaming Control Act.
- Bill 77, An Act to Amend the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act.

And that the Committee had directed that he report progress on the following Bills:

- Bill 57 An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Act.
- Bill 59, An Act to Amend the Municipalities Act.
- Bill 80, Nursing Homes Pension Plans Act.

And the Committee asked leave to make a further report.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.

And then, 10.02 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
