Due to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Speaker, Mr. Fraser, the Deputy Speaker, took the chair as Acting Speaker.

Mr. Urquhart gave Notice of Motion 58 that on Thursday, May 21, 2009, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Huntjens:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documentation or communication, however recorded or stored, related to any cost analysis, reports, community discussions or third-party consultation related to the decision to build the new jail in Shediac.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. D. Graham, Acting Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, May 14, 2009, Opposition Members' Business would be considered in the following order: second reading of Bills 60 and 61; followed by resumption of the debate at second reading of Bills 53 and 50.

Hon. Mr. Lamrock, Acting Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Environment and the Department of Wellness, Culture and Sport.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Ms. Robichaud in the chair.
