Due to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Speaker, Mr. Fraser, the Deputy Speaker, took the chair as Acting Speaker.

Hon. Mr. Kenny laid upon the table of the House the following document: *Seniors' Guide to Services and Programs, Being Informal in your community.*

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. Holder, Acting Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, May 21, 2009, Opposition Members' Business would be considered in the following order: second reading of Bill 61; Motions 60 and 59; second reading of Bill 53, followed by resumption of the debate on Motion 54, followed by resumption of the debate at second reading of Bill 50.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Agriculture and Aquaculture and Business New Brunswick.
