Bill 84, *An Act to Amend An Act Respecting the New Brunswick Medical Society and the College of Physicians and Surgeons of New Brunswick*;

which it recommends to the favourable consideration of the House.

Your Committee also had under consideration:

Bill 37, *An Act to Amend An Act to Incorporate The New Brunswick Registered Barbers' Association*;

and reports that it has made certain progress therein.

And your Committee begs leave to make a further report.
