Debatable Motions

Motion 9 by Mr. Alward, seconded by Mr. Holder to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

WHEREAS decent, affordable housing and shelter is a basic human right; and

WHEREAS our homes influence our well-being, our sense of worth, and our ties to families, communities and work; and

WHEREAS good housing policies promote social justice, better health, higher educational attainment, and employment;

WHEREAS safe, adequate and affordable housing is a key determinant of health and supports the physical, psychological and social well-being essential for a healthy life;

WHEREAS available program funding is not adequate to met the demands for those programs in New Brunswick; and

WHEREAS waiting lists for available housing programs are excessive;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislature establish a Select Committee on Housing to investigate the status of affordable housing in New Brunswick, including the role of NB Housing Corporation, and to make recommendations to the Legislature to ensure that all New Brunswickers have access to affordable housing opportunity.

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documents relating to the privatization of services or goods in connection with hospital and medical services in New Brunswick. **Motion 3 by Mr. Steeves**, seconded by Mr. Urquhart to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all financial information detailing the full cost to change and implement the Government's new logo for each department and agency including the cost associated with updating websites, business cards, letterhead and any other government material on which the New Brunswick logo was changed for use.

Motion 4 by Mr. MacDonald, seconded by Mr. Robichaud to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all documents and information in the possession of Government or any Crown Corporation related to the budgeted cost to move the Marion 8200 drag line at the Salmon Harbor Mine from its former location to its new location, including the amount that had been budgeted for the project and the current amount that has been spent on the project.

Motion 5 by Mrs. Blaney, seconded by Mr. C. Landry to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House a list of all doctors and medical specialists (with their area of specialization) hired by New Brunswick's Health Authorities since December 1st, 2007, also include a list of all doctors and medical specialists that have resigned or retired from New Brunswick's Health Authorities during the same period.

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House detailed expense reports for each Minister, Deputy Minister, Assistant Deputy Minister, Executive Assistant and Special Assistant since March 11, 2008.

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information, correspondence, memorandum to Departments and agencies regarding changes to government policy with respect to the handling, shipping, receiving and treatment of personal information in any format since the Department of Health lost personal information March 1st, 2008.

Motion 10 by Mr. Mockler, seconded by Mr. Olscamp to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House full itineraries and schedules of Premiers attending the Francophone Summit in Quebec City, a list of New Brunswick representatives in attendance, their expenses and their role at the summit, as well as a list of Premiers' meetings with representatives from different countries and a list of the countries or representatives that requested but did not have a meeting.

Motion 11 by Ms. Dubé, seconded by Mr. Alward to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information in the possession of government related to repatriation statistics, including the number of persons repatriated and the number of persons who have left the province since October 1, 2006.

Motion 12 by Mr. Holder, seconded by Mr. Jack Carr to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all statistics in the possession of government regarding persons that left social assistance since October 2006, including all statistics relevant to the data referred to by Minister Schryer where she reported that 1433 households were no longer on social assistance, how those clients receive their revenue now, how many have a job and the number of clients that have returned to social assistance since leaving.

Motion 13 by Mr. Fitch, seconded by Mr. Mockler to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information in the possession of government related to Premier Graham's Mission to China including all persons representing the Province of New Brunswick, schedules and itineraries of meetings, trip agenda and any memorandum, report or correspondence regarding the outcome of any meeting held during the mission.

Motion 14 by Mr. P. Robichaud, seconded by Mr. Fitch to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 4, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all correspondence, communication and information related to the province's deal with TransAlta for windmill energy production in the Moncton region, including any details related to the cost of electricity, total cost to the province, all fees and rates for energy generation, including all extra costs of any nature related to this project which will be assumed by the Province of New Brunswick, including any information to government subsidies for this source of power generation that were included in the deal.

Motion 15 by Mr. Jody Carr, seconded by Mr. Harrison to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 11, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information in the possession of government related to the current regions and populations of New Brunswick currently served

by high speed broadband internet providers and a list of regions and populations of New

Brunswick currently served by high speed broadband internet providers and a list of regions and their populations currently without broadband internet access.

Motion 17 by Mr. Betts, seconded by Mr. Landry to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 11, 2008:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information and correspondence in the possession of government related to the current use and any information related to a possible future ban of cosmetic pesticides in the Province of New Brunswick, including all correspondence between the provincial government, local governments and interested parties related to the effects cosmetic pesticides have on their surroundings.
