OPPOSITION MEMBERS' MOTIONS

Debatable Motions

Motion 26 by Mr. MacDonald, seconded by Mr. Northrup to propose the following resolution on Thursday, December 18, 2008:

WHEREAS New Brunswick's forest industry is undergoing unprecedented changes and hardships; and

WHEREAS these hardships are being felt by thousands of New Brunswickers including the 40,000 woodlot-owning families; and

WHEREAS the seven regional woodlot marketing boards and the Federation of Woodlot Owners are also being negatively impacted by the economic crisis facing the industry; and

WHEREAS these eight organizations provide considerable support and services to the industry, including silviculture, certification, education and training, market development, forest management, administration of government programs, non-timber forest products, woodlot owner rights, and day-to-day inquiries; and

WHEREAS in 2007, the Self-Sufficiency Task Force recommended that the Government should "*support private woodlot marketing boards in strengthening their role with respect to silviculture, certification, education and market development,*" and that said recommendation should be acted upon within one year; and

WHEREAS in January 2008, the Government of Canada provided the Government of New Brunswick with \$30 million through the Community Development Trust; and

WHEREAS the province and the forestry industry would benefit from having strong private woodlot marketing boards and a strong federation; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislative Assembly urge the government to consider the advisability of providing a one per cent per acre tax sharing on the private woodlot land base to the Federation of Woodlot Owners and another one cent per acre tax sharing on the private woodlot land base to the regional marketing boards as a source of sustainable funding; and, that said tax sharing, if implemented, remain in place for a period of three years.

[Debate interrupted due to expiration of time.]

Motion 52 by Mr. MacDonald, seconded by Mr. Urquhart to propose the following resolution on Thursday, April 23, 2009:

WHEREAS the Mactaquac Provincial Park was built as part of a historic commitment by Premier Louis J. Robichaud to the people of York County; and

WHEREAS the Mactaquac Provincial Park has served as a key employer in the York County Region for both year-round and seasonal employees; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Park hosts an average of 18,000 visitors during the winter season alone and is a vital economic aspect of the York County region during all seasons of the year for both employment and revenue generated by the visitors; and

WHEREAS the Mactaquac Provincial Park facility also serves as a key supplier of water for local fire departments during all four seasons of operation; and

WHEREAS the employees of the park are also an integral part of the Remembrance Day ceremonies at the portion of the Mactaquac Park known as York Centennial; and

WHEREAS the proposed cuts to the provincial park budget for the winter season will negatively effect the operation and maintenance of the park during the spring and fall seasons and hinder the quality of service provided during the busy summer months; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislative Assembly urge the provincial government to meet with the employees and key stakeholders of the Mactaquac Provincial Park to determine alternate methods of generating increased revenue and alternate methods to reduce costs to ensure that this critical facility remains open year-round to serve all the people of New Brunswick that use this park throughout the year to enhance their physical wellness and to enjoy the beauty of the Mactaquac Region.

Motion 54 by Mr. Alward, seconded by Mr. Fitch to propose the following resolution on Thursday, April 23, 2009:

WHEREAS economies across Canada have been in a state of decline during recent months and local, provincial and federal governments have been searching for tools to infuse money into regions to generate more stable financial markets; and

WHEREAS the province of New Brunswick is currently facing an extremely difficult financial position with yearly deficits increasing and the provincial net debt growing at an unsustainable rate that will have negative impacts on the province's finances for decades and generations to come; and

WHEREAS research and development funds must be a key component to revitalizing the New Brunswick economy by investing money in education, technology, infrastructure, and industry; and

WHEREAS New Brunswick currently ranks as one of the lowest amongst all Canadian Provinces for investments in research and development from federal, provincial, business, non-profit organizations, higher education, and foreign investment sectors; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislative Assembly urge the government to seek out every available resource for increased funding including new federal, provincial, and private industry funds so that this vital component of our economy can help New Brunswickers and our businesses revitalize our provincial economy in order to return this province to one of job creation, prosperity, and a leader in technology, research and development of world class products and services.

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information, in any format, in the possession of the Government related to advertising purchased to promote the Department of Health, services the Department provides or the Minister responsible since March 1st, 2008 to December 18th, 2008.

Motion 35 by Mrs. Poirier, seconded by Mr. Alward to propose the following resolution on Thursday, March 26, 2009:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all information in the possession of government including emails, memorandum, correspondence of any kind, meeting minutes, market studies or analysis, cost analysis, and all contract information however recorded or stored related to the New Brunswick Liquor Corporation's decision to produce, sell and market *Selection Lager* and *Selection Light* beer through Moosehead Breweries.

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House a list of all contracts awarded through the Department of Supply and Services including personal service contracts, that received an exemption under section 27 of the Regulations of the *Public Purchasing Act* including the department that issued the contract, the names of any individuals or companies that received contracts and the dollar amount that was awarded from April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009.
