Mr. Steeves welcomed to the House Mr. Michael Currie, Progressive Conservative Member of the Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island. Mr. MacIntyre joined with Mr. Steeves in this regard.

Mr. Jack Carr, Member for New Maryland-Sunbury West, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Napan, Black River Bridge, Douglastown, Miramichi and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 146)

Mr. C. LeBlanc, Member for Dieppe Centre-Lewisville, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Dalhousie and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 147)

Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Grand Manan area who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 148)

Mr. Holder, Member for Saint John Portland, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Rothesay, Saint John, Little Lepreau, Hampton and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 149)

Mr. Williams, Member for Kent South, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of home support workers at Le Phare des services Communautaires in Bouctouche urging the government to allocate more funding to the home support industry. (Petition 150)

Mr. Speaker interrupted Oral Questions and requested that Mr. Robichauud withdraw the term "incompetent" in reference to the Minister of Energy, which he did.

Mr. Alward gave Notice of Motion 34 that on Thursday, January 28, 2010, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Robichaud:

WHEREAS the people of New Brunswick are the principle shareholders of NB Power and its assets; and

WHEREAS the Premier's decision to sell off many of those assets and transmission rights to Hydro-Québec without the consent of the people has created tremendous public backlash because the people of New Brunswick were not consulted about the deal; and

WHEREAS there are many questions surrounding the final written contract between Hydro-Québec and the province of New Brunswick because the government has chosen to keep many aspects of the negotiated deal between the two parties involved secret;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislative Assembly urge this government to table the contract between the province of New Brunswick and Hydro-Québec a minimum of 30 days before the deal is signed so that the final agreement can receive the essential public scrutiny that it requires and the shareholders deserve.

Mr. Jody Carr gave Notice of Motion 35 that on Thursday, January 28, 2010, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Alward:

WHEREAS timely access to the justice system is fundamental in providing a just and democratic society, and

WHEREAS Legal Aid is a fundamental necessity that helps ensure timely access to justice especially for vulnerable citizens, including women who are experiencing family violence, Aboriginal women, and those of low income; and

WHEREAS the government of New Brunswick has cut funding for Legal Aid during the last two consecutive budgets and eliminated court mediators despite the government's own reports recommending otherwise; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislative Assembly urge the government to form a provincial action committee with representatives from government departments and community representatives mandated to implement recommendations to improve access to family court services, expand the use of alternatives to family courts to resolve family law issues, and provide increased access to legal information and legal aid in family law matters.

Hon. Mr. Arseneault, Deputy Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Supply and Services; following which, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider Bills 12 and 7. It was agreed by unanimous consent to sit through the noon recess and to adjourn at 3 o'clock p.m.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Ms. Robichaud in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Ms. Robichaud, the Chair, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, had passed several items and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.
