Mr. Paulin, Member for Restigouche-la-Vallée, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Saint-Quentin and surrounding areas urging the government to allow the use of ATVs on the former rail lines from Glencoe to Tide Head. (Petition 182)

Mr. Williams, Member for Kent South, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Newcastle, Chatham, Miramichi, Eel Ground, Halcomb, Barnaby, Trout Brook and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 183)

Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Renous, Miramichi, Beaverbrook, Bellefond, Sunny Corner, Douglastown and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 184)

Mr. C. LeBlanc, Member for Dieppe Centre-Lewisville, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Miramichi, Maple Glen, Russellville, Sunny Corner, Williston, Whitney, Strathadam, Bartibog Bridge, Chatham, Blackville, Newcastle, Eel Ground and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 185)

Mr. Speaker interrupted proceedings and reminded Members that statements made during Statements by Members are limited to not more than 60 seconds.

Hon. Mr. Byrne, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Health.

It was agreed by unanimous consent to sit through the noon recess and to adjourn at 3 o'clock p.m.

And after some further time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Ms. Robichaud, the Chair, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.

And then, 3 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
