It was agreed by unanimous consent to revert to the Order of Condolences and Messages of Sympathy

It was agreed by unanimous consent to extend the time reserved for Oral Questions by 15 minutes.

The following Bill was introduced and read a first time:

By Hon. Mr. Williams,

Bill 14, *An Act to Dissolve the Saint John Harbour Bridge Authority.*

The following Private Bill was introduced and read a first time:

By Ms. Wilson,

Bill 15, *An Act to Amend An Act Respecting Building Officials and the New Brunswick Building Officials Association.*

Ordered that the said Bill be referred to the Standing Committee on Private Bills.

Mr. Fraser gave Notice of Motion 23 that on Thursday, March 31, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Albert:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House a list of the names, job titles, job descriptions and remuneration of all persons hired by all departments, Crown Corporations, boards, commissions and agencies, including but not limited to Executive Assistants, Special Assistants and Policy Advisors, by the Province on a contract, term, casual, part-time or full-time basis since October 12th, 2010.

Mr. Melanson gave Notice of Motion 24 that on Thursday, March 31, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Fraser:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House detailed information—including flight records, final

destination, duration of stay, unscheduled stops, and occupants—however recorded, stored, or archived, by electronic means or otherwise, related to the operation and usage since October 12, 2010, of the airplane leased by the province and any other airplane leased by the province of New Brunswick since October 12, 2010.

Mr. Doucet gave Notice of Motion 25 that on Thursday, March 31, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Bertrand LeBlanc:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House any and all information in the possession of the government related to ad campaigns launched in and out of New Brunswick by the current Progressive Conservative government since October 12th, 2010, including ads on consultation, including mandates, terms of reference, budgets, lists of firms, principals of firms, contracts awarded to firms, personnel, salaries, ad transcripts, tender processes, lists of tenders and proposals, and a copy of the contracts.

Mr. Albert gave Notice of Motion 26 that on Thursday, March 31, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. D. Landry:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House a list of the names, job titles, job descriptions, and remuneration of all persons in contract, term, casual, part-time, or full-time positions who have been transferred by the province to another department, including Crown corporations, boards, agencies, and commissions, since October 12, 2010.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Williams, seconded by the Honourable the Premier:

RESOLVED, that when the Assembly adjourns on Friday, April 15, 2011, it stand adjourned until Tuesday, April 26, 2011; and

That when the Assembly adjourns on Friday, May 13, 2011, it stand adjourned until Tuesday, May 24, 2011.

With leave of the House to dispense with notice, Hon. Mr. Williams moved, seconded by the Honourable the Premier: (Motion 27)

That the membership of the Standing Committee on Legislative Officers be amended by substituting the name of Mr. Tait for Mr. B. Macdonald; and

That the membership of the Select Committee on Point Lepreau be amended by substituting the name of Mr. Killen for Mr. Davis.

And the question being put, the motion was carried.

With leave of the House to dispense with notice, Hon. Mr. Williams moved, seconded by the Honourable the Premier: (Motion 28)

That, pursuant to section 32.1 of the Legislative Assembly Act, the Legislative Assembly delegate to the Legislative Administration Committee its authority under the Act with respect to amounts, indemnities, allowances and salaries and with respect to the amendment of Schedule A.

And the question being put, the motion was carried.

Hon. Mr. Williams, Acting Government House Leader, gave notice that on Friday, March 25, 2011, Bill 14 would be called for second reading.

And then, 12.05 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
