Prayers.

Mr. Fraser, Member for Miramichi-Bay du Vin, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of concerned citizens of Miramichi urging the government to build a new K-5 elementary school to replace the loss of the schools in their community. (Petition 13)

Mr. McLean, Member for Victoria-Tobique, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of regular users of Route 105 between Upper Kent and Perth-Andover urging the government to immediately initiate the rehabilitation of the road. (Petition 14)

Mr. Collins gave Notice of Motion 41 that on Thursday, April 21, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Bernard LeBlanc:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all actuarial reports on home insurance, including the Olivier Wyman Reports, completed for the province of New Brunswick between October 30, 2006 and today.

Mr. Collins gave Notice of Motion 42 that on Thursday, April 21, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Bernard LeBlanc:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all actuarial reports on car insurance, including the Olivier Wyman Reports, completed for the province of New Brunswick between October 30, 2006 and today.

Hon. P. Robichaud gave Notice of Motion 43 that on Tuesday, April 26, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by the Honourable the Premier:

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. Fraser, Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, April 14, 2011, Opposition Members' Business would be considered in the following order: Motion 37, 38 and 5.

Hon. P. Robichaud, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Tourism and Parks and the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Urguhart in the chair.

At 12.38 o'clock p.m., Mr. Urquhart left the chair to resume again at 2.15 o'clock p.m.
