Prayers.

Mr. Fraser, Member for Miramichi-Bay du Vin, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of concerned citizens of Miramichi urging the government to build a new K-5 elementary school to replace the loss of the schools in their community. (Petition 18)

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Ms. Wilson, Member for Petitcodiac, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Charles Lutes Road and surrounding areas urging the government to provide a proper and safe road on which to drive or walk. (Petition 19)

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Mr. Arseneault, Member for Dalhousie-Restigouche East, laid upon the table of the House a petition in relation to the elimination of the film tax credit. Mr. Speaker ruled the petition out of order, as it was in electronic form and lacked original signatures, and returned it to the Member.

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Mr. Doucet, Member for Charlotte-The Isles, laid upon the table of the House a petition urging the government to hold a full inquiry to determine the factors involved in the flooding events on Lake Utopia and the Magaguadavic River in December 2010 and, whether preventative measures by industry or legislated controls by government would have been beneficial in lessening the damage to properties, livelihoods and the environment. (Petition 20)

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Hon. P. Robichaud, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House consider Motion 43, following which, the House would resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to take into consideration the estimates of the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.

Hon. P. Robichaud gave notice that on Wednesday, April 27, 2011, Bill 24 would be called for second reading.

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Pursuant to Notice of Motion 43, Hon. P. Robichaud, seconded by the Honourable the Premier, moved the following resolution:

THAT, notwithstanding Standing Rule 29(1), the time for the daily meeting and sitting of the Assembly shall be as follows:

THAT this Special Order shall come into effect immediately upon its adoption and shall remain in effect for the remainder of the First Session of the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly.

And the question being put, a debate ensued.

And the debate being ended and the question being put, Motion 43 was carried.

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The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Urquhart in the chair.

At 6 o'clock p.m., Mr. Urquhart left the chair, to resume again at 7 o'clock p.m.

The Committee resumed.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Urquhart, the Chair, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.

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And then, 10 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
