Mr. Arseneault, Member for Dalhousie-Restigouche East, laid upon the table of the House a petition urging the government to reverse the decision to eliminate the Film Tax Credit. (Petition 30)

Mr. Albert, Member for Caraquet, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of the Saint-Léolin municipal council in opposition to the proposed closure of Le Maillon School. (Petition 31)
