The Honourable the Premier paid tribute to the memory of the late Wallace McCain, a cofounder of McCain Foods Limited. A widely recognized New Brunswick entrepreneur and philanthropist, he was an Officer of the Order of Canada, a Companion of the Order of Canada, and he was inducted into the Canadian and the New Brunswick Business Halls of Fame.

Mr. Boudreau, Member for Shediac—Cap-Pelé, laid upon the table of the House a petition urging the government to reinstate the funding allocated to the New Brunswick Advisory Council on the Status of Women. (Petition 49)

Mr. Fraser, Member for Miramichi-Bay du Vin, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of concerned citizens of Napan and surrounding areas urging the government to keep Napan Elementary School open and properly equipped. (Petition 51)

Hon. Mr. Leonard laid upon the table of the House a document entitled *Final Report, New Brunswick Energy Commission, 2010-*2011.

Mr. Melanson gave Notice of Motion 87 that on Thursday, June 2, 2011, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. D. Landry:

THAT an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House a list of the names, job descriptions, and job titles, of all persons whose employment with the Department of Business New Brunswick was terminated as a result of a reorganization of the department and the creation of the entity known as Invest NB, and who were provided the option of early retirement.

Hon. Mr. Williams, Acting Government House Leader, announced that following third reading, it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Local Government, Service New Brunswick, and the Department of Health.

Hon. Mr. Williams gave notice that on Wednesday, May 25, 2011, Bill 29 would be called for second reading.

The following Bills were read a third time:

- Bill 22, An Act to Amend the Public Interest Disclosure Act.
- Bill 26, An Act to Amend the Transportation of Primary Forest Products Act.

Ordered that the said Bills do pass.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Urquhart in the chair.
