The following Bill was introduced and read a first time:

## By Mr. C. Chiasson, Bill 18, An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Act.

Mr. Cullins gave Notice of Motion 38 that on Tuesday, December 12, 2023, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Dawson:

THAT, notwithstanding the Standing Rules of the Legislative Assembly, following the adoption of this motion, there shall be 10 hours allocated for the proceedings at all stages of the passage of Bill 17 which shall include the hours spent considering said Bill from December 1, 2023, and onward, and at the expiration of the said 10 hours, unless sooner concluded, the Speaker, or the Chair of the Committee of the Whole House, as the case may be, shall interrupt the proceedings and put every question necessary to dispose of the order for second reading of the said Bill; the order for consideration of the said Bill in committee and report of the Bill to the House; and the order for third reading and passage of the said Bill; and where necessary, the said Bill shall be allowed to advance more than one stage in one day;

THAT, notwithstanding the expiry of the said 10 hours, there shall be, if necessary, 20 minutes allocated at committee stage for the consideration of the said Bill, if requested by the Government House Leader.

Mr. Arseneault rose on a point of order and submitted that Motion 38 was out of order as it proposed an order of the House by a Private Member. Mr. Speaker ruled the point not well taken and reminded the House that he had previously ruled favourably on the admissibility of time allocation motions proposed in this manner.

Mr. Arseneault, Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, December 7, 2023, Opposition Members' Business would be considered in the following order: Third Party Item, Motion 21 and 5.

Mr. Arseneau gave notice that the Third Party Item would be Motion 29.

Hon. Mr. G. Savoie, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that Bill 17 be called for second reading.

Debate resumed on the adjourned debate on the amendment to the motion that Bill 17, *Pension Plan Sustainability and Transfer Act*, be now read a second time, moved by Mr. Coon, seconded by Mr. Arseneau, on December 5, 2023.

At 12 p.m. the House recessed. At 1 p.m. the House resumed.

And the debate being ended on the amendment, and the question being put, it was resolved in the negative on the following recorded division:
