# CENTRE COMMUNAUTAIRE SAINTE-ANNE IN FREDERICTON: A truly Francophone institution

## MISSION

The Centre communautaire Sainte-Anne seeks to engage the Francophone community of greater Fredericton while promoting its development, expansion and visibility.

## VISION

The Centre communautaire Sainte-Anne is a catalyst for the development, engagement and promotion of the Francophone community in the greater Fredericton area.

The Centre communautaire Sainte-Anne (CCSA) is a Crown corporation responsible for the administration, on behalf of the Government of New Brunswick, of a community centre serving primarily the Francophone community in the Fredericton area.

Officially opening its doors on June 10, 1978, the CCSA was the first school-community institution of its kind in Canada. It is administered by the Sainte-Anne Community Board, guided in turn by the *Le Centre communautaire Sainte-Anne Act*.

When the CCSA first opened nearly 50 years ago, the Francophone population in New Brunswick's capital region numbered around 3,000. Today, this figure exceeds 11,000, proof that the Francophone community served by the CCSA continues to grow.

Over the years, the CCSA has become a leader in innovation and in community and cultural development in a minority setting. It offers a wealth of French-language programming and, with the invaluable support of numerous accredited organizations and partners, promotes the Francophonie in the Fredericton area.

# Message from the Chair


During the past year, the CCSA held a series of meetings with the mayors of the four surrounding municipalities as well as with ministers, opposition party leaders and other elected members. These meetings included interactions with Blaine Higgs, premier of New Brunswick, and ministers Glen Savoie (Françophonie), Arlene Dunn (Immigration), Bill Hogan (Education and Early Childhood Development) and Rob Taylor (Transportation and Infrastructure). These meetings culminated in a slight budget increase, although this was not enough to offset the CCSA's deficit. The building's repair and maintenance plan has been relaunched and should lead to major investments over the coming years, so watch for announcements. Funding for the CCSA, especially in light of the growing Francophone community, remains a priority and strategic concern.

In March 2024, Pascale Bergeron was appointed executive director of the CCSA following the sudden passing of her predecessor, Eric Nadeau. The CCSA team and the Francophone community in the Fredericton area are in good hands.

We also implemented intake and settlement services for newcomers to complement the liaison services already provided by the CCSA. This partnership with the Centre d'accueil et d'accompagnement francophone des immigrants du Sud-Est du Nouveau-Brunswick (CAFi) and the province's two other school-community centres is certain to grow.

We have also engaged in new discussions with Horizon Health Network and senior officials responsible for recruiting Francophone healthcare professionals. This will be a lengthy process.

I want to underscore the incredible dedication of the Sainte-Anne Community Board and thank the CCSA employees who have worked tirelessly, often with limited resources and in times of significant instability. Their contributions sometimes go unnoticed but remain a cornerstone of life in French in the Fredericton area.



- ▶ Training was provided to École Sainte-Anne's in-house theatre technical crew by the CCSA's technical director.






Audited results to March 31, 2024


# Infrastructure

The maintenance staff play an essential role in keeping all 275,000 square feet of the CCSA operating smoothly. The skilled and dedicated workers on this team are responsible for general building maintenance, minor repairs and the installation of various equipment to ensure a safe and functional environment for users, staff and students.

The team's seasoned technical staff carried out a wide variety of tasks throughout the year, including minor repairs (electrical, plumbing, carpentry, ventilation, heating and other) as well as installation and inspection work. 
