

**CALL FOR APPLICATIONS**  
**NEW BRUNSWICK LEGISLATIVE INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY**  
**JANUARY – JUNE 2024**

Applications are now open for the New Brunswick Legislative Internship Program (NBLIP)!

The NBLIP is an excellent opportunity for New Brunswick university students to acquire practical knowledge of the provincial legislative process and the many roles of Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs). Interns will be involved in public policy development and the mechanisms of political accountability. Interns will gain hands-on experience in the operation of democratic government in New Brunswick. Interns may also qualify for academic credit for participating in the NBLIP.

Two interns will be selected. Each will work 20 hours per week from January to June, 2024. Interns will receive a stipend of approximately \$15/hour. Some duties can be performed remotely, while others may require attendance at the Assembly in Fredericton.

Interns act in a non-partisan capacity under the supervision of the Office of the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly to provide research and other assistance to Members of the Legislative Assembly, legislative committees, and to Officers of the Assembly such as the Auditor-General and Chief Electoral Officer.

Admission into the Program is competitive. A successful applicant will:

- be a third- or fourth-year student at a New Brunswick university;
- major in Political Science or a related discipline, or otherwise possess a demonstrated knowledge of the parliamentary legislative process and governmental system;
- possess excellent inter-personal skills;
- be able to take direction, work independently and remotely, and manage a variety of tasks; and
- have a strong academic record, including excellent written and oral communication skills.
- An ability to communicate in both official languages is preferred.

Qualified applicants must be, and must be seen to be, non-partisan.
